

Teen Trail Corps Coordinator

ROLE DESCRIPTION:

The Teen Trail Corps Coordinator is a role that is filled by a dedicated and skilled NICA licensed coach whose primary area of responsibility is supporting the League Director in selected areas to implement NICA's Teen Trail Corps program. In addition to fulfilling the responsibilities as indicated by the League Director, this position will serve as a primary contact for the TTC coaches within the league and as a representative for those coaches within a national guild made up of Teen Trail Corps Coordinators from all NICA leagues. The Teen Trail Corps Coordinator is under the direction of the League Director in conjunction with the NICA Teen Trail Corps Program Manager.

Responsibilities:

- Guide and track league TTC participation
- Organize, manage and execute trail work parties throughout the pre season and season
- Identify, assess and organize trail work needed at venues used for league produced season events
- Educate teams and local IMBA chapters (Delaware Trail Spinners) on Teen Trail Corps
- Develop relationships with regional trail and advocacy groups to create a working partnership with league, teams, and student-athletes
- In coordination with teams and those advocacy groups develop trail maintenance and advocacy opportunities
- Support coaches in developing team TTC programs and events
- Support coaches in supporting student-athletes complete TTC activities and badges
- Communicate regularly on the progress of efforts, either via written communication with the program director or in person on regularly occurring league calls.

Ideal characteristics:

- Experienced NICA Coach or familiar with the NICA Program
- Level 1 coach training required
- Self-starting and highly engaged
- Understand how relationships between land managers and IMBA chapters (Delaware Trail Spinners) are structured
- Active in trail work and maintenance efforts in your local area
- Cognizant of the advocacy challenges around the state
- Has been involved in other advocacy efforts, and understands how to connect with government officials and others who may be targets of advocacy work

The amount of time needed for the TTC Coordinator position is largely dependent on how many events the Coordinator and the League Director have planned for the season.
